Did you know that beach cleanups have been going on in the USVI for more than 30 years? Let's take a look at the things that volunteers find the most when picking up debris on our sandy beaches.

Listed below are the five most commonly found items from past beach cleanups. ### Be a Debris Detective!

There are four easy things you can do to help flight marine debris. We call them the "Four Rs:"

- 1 Refuse As mush as possible, say "no thanks" to items that are made of or packaged in plastic, and reach for ones that are reusable!
- 2 Reduce If you have to use plastic, try to cut back on the amount.
- 3 Reuse We have to get creative! Whenever you can, find ways to recycle and reuse your trash with new purposes. When things break, try to repair them before tossing them out.
- 4 React If you see debris, clean it up! Remind others to practice these four Rs.

























#### Where Should You Toss It?













You can use a glass crusher to break up used glass bottles into sand. The sand can then be used to fill sandbags that your family can use during hurricane season.

To cut down on your waste headed to the landfill, you can work with your family to create a compost bin where you can turn your carboard and food scraps into rich soil for your plants.











#### **Identifying the Problem (Page 1)**


